### Red Thread 101

Red Thread is a common summer fungus that appears when weather conditions create the perfect moist and acidic lawn environment for fungus to grow. It manifests itself as pink and brown dinner plate-sized spots in your grass. The discoloration occurs when the fungus affects the grass blade tips.

Red Thread is most noticeable after a few days of warm temperatures (70 degrees or higher) and rainfall. You may see it only in sunny areas of your lawn and not in the shade, as sunlight activates the fungus.

There are steps you can take to help reduce the spread of this disease on your lawn:

- 1. Bag your mower clippings and dump off-site.
- 2. Sharpen & wash off your mower blades before & after you mow.

- 3. Avoid any night/evening watering. This will only aggravate the fungus and enable further spread.
- If you have an irrigation system, allow the lawn to dry out for a few days.



The easiest way to avoid lawn fungus is through proper maintenance and nourishment of the lawn to enhance microbial life in the ground. ## Mosquito Tips

Late May into early June is the official start to mosquito season here in Massachusetts. With a summer of possible rainfall and thunderstorms ahead of us, it is important to stay up to date on best practices to keep mosquito populations at bay. Aside from being a nuisance to your outdoor fun, mosquitoes leave behind pesky, itchy bites. On rare occasions, mosquitoes can transmit diseases like Triple E and West Nile Virus. Follow these three steps to minimize your contact with mosquitoes this summer:



1. Use bug repellent with DEET when spending time outdoors, especially in the evening. Mosquitoes are more active at night when out of direct sunlight.



2. Empty freestanding water traps regularly. Mosquitoes can lay hundreds of eggs in water pools as small as 1/4th of an inch, so it's important to eliminate possible breeding grounds.



3. Keep tall grass trimmed back. Mosquitoes lay dormant in shady areas during the day to stay out of the sun and avoid getting dehydrated.
